Our new website, magazine, e-news, winter workshop, conference, sale and exhibition have continued to provide our members information, education and opportunities to sell and exhibit their work. I would like to thank the board and all other volunteers who worked so hard to make all of our programs successful this year.

We had a great conference in Ottawa with Sam Chung and Joan Bruneau. Thank you to Susan Card and Carol Badenoch and her team in Ottawa for all their hard work. It was at this conference that we initiated several new events, including a very successful fundraising mug sale. We also saw some very interesting and well received FUSION aprons and t-shirts thanks to Barb Banfield. Lillian Forester once again organized a great winter workshop with Simon Leach in Peterborough. Most recently, thanks to Jane Klarer-Lackey, FUSION initiated a fantastic new database. We are also, for the first time, on Facebook. Derek Chung has kept us all informed with our regular E-News. Jane Thewell organized the Clay and Glass Show, and Susan Card with help from many board members has been organizing this years Fireworks.

The FUSION office has had several changes this year. We have reduced the number of hours the office is open for most of the year to reflect the amount of work needing to be done in the office. We also have a new office administrator, Jenanne Longman.

The FUSION board has had some positive changes. We have several new, and very active members. Chiho Tokita, Arlene Kushnir, Cindy Dron, Carol Holmes-Kerr, Heather Wood, and Chris Snedden have joined the board.

Your board, both new and returning members, look forward to a new year, the upcoming Fireworks Exhibition, new workshops, and an expansion of the our new website.

Secretary's Report

Janet Cox, Secretary

I have been Secretary to the FUSION Board of Directors for some 18 months now. In that time I have been largely engaged in the usual work of the Secretary to the Board. In addition, in the absence of a Director of Development, I have been looking for funding and writing grant applications on behalf of FUSION. Our operating funding from the Ontario Arts Council is holding firm. We have been successful in getting funding to significantly increase the budget available to promote the Pottery & Glass Show, and we are aggressively looking for funding for FUSION's new mentorship programme. I have had an opportunity to review, with the help of pro bono legal services, all of FUSION's contracts to ensure they comply with the by-laws, they are binding and enforceable, and address any areas of potential liability FUSION.

Next year, I will turn my attention to the by-laws, which need to be updated, simplified and brought into line with FUSION's evolving practices. I expect to be looking to you to ratify a new set of by-laws at the Annual General Meeting in London in May 2012.

Finance Report

Deborah Freeman, Director

FUSION's fiscal 2011 operations have resulted in a small surplus before amortization of capital property expenses (a non-cash expense). This good news is due to several factors. FUSION board members ran the office for six months; we updated our database to a system that is less time consuming to use resulting in further administrative time savings as well as reduced technical support costs. The modest increase in membership fees from 2010 to 2011 is also helping to cover expenses that do not vary directly with the organization's level of activity such as insurance, audit fees, phone, internet and office rent.

In fiscal 2011, we took the opportunity to clean-up some old liabilities that were sitting on the books. We wrote off the remaining \$910 worth of cookbooks we have not sold (in fiscal 2010, we wrote off the first half at \$910 as well) and because we've upgraded our database, we recognized the \$9,175 of remaining value of the older database as an additional amortization expense. These two actions will enable our future statements to more accurately reflect the state of the organization.

Our cash position has stabilized. We are no longer drawing heavily on cash reserves for day-to-day operations. We are using these reserves to move forward with new initiatives such as the Mentorship Program while new funding is sought for these programs.

Moving forward, our goal remains to find ways to operate FUSION in a manner that creates fiscal stability which will enable us to continue delivering and developing innovative programs to serve our members better.

Membership Report

It's been a great year and we have accomplished a lot. We have transferred our membership system over to an online content/membership management system that is purchased as a service. This change has significantly brought down the cost of managing the website, online membership renewals and event registrations. The system also has a number of features that will be implemented in the future.

New and renewing members can now purchase their memberships online. Emails reminders are sent out automatically one month, two weeks prior and the day of expiry. We can also review the membership numbers daily through a dashboard that gives us an overview for each membership level. This system also provides us with more accurate history of payments, search and reporting features for auditing and reporting to the Ontario Arts Council and the ability to search for contact/members to send out emails.

The current membership stands at approximately 425. Although this is a healthy membership we hope that our new programs will help retain and increase our membership numbers.

This year I will be retiring as the Director of Membership and would like to thank everyone on the FUSION team for the support, hard work and team effort. It truly has been a wonderful experience and a delight to work with everyone. I will miss being part of this team.

Publications/Marketing Report

Helen Rudin (FUSION Magazine editor) continues, with the assistance of a roster of writers, to produce the FUSION magazine with diverse and interesting articles about clay and glass artists and subject matter. She is also supported by Patrick Kilbourn (Designer) with the magazine design and layout. The goal is maintaining and increasing our readership and the content, along with the much needed advertising revenue. Thanks to both Helen and Patrick for their continued good work.

The FUSION website has seen a new look evolving as the front end aspect of the database system. The website will continue to evolve and offer even more features (also mentioned in the above Membership Report) to the FUSION membership – such as an online forums, online event registrations, calendar of events, etc. The new system also allows FUSION to broadcast information not just to current FUSION members but to a large list of Contacts so everyone is aware of upcoming events, call for entries, and news. This allows for a greater readership of the FUSION emails and enews with live weblinks.

FUSION on Facebook is a recent development for the organization in keeping with the social media trend and using this communication tool as another vehicle for both informing those connected FUSION members and 'fans' about ongoing and upcoming events, news and information and ultimately reaching a wider online audience both local and international

Advocacy/External Relations Report

My work this year on behalf of FUSION included attending board meetings to participate in the myriad discussion and decisions that continually form the organization. It's a new "Fireworks" year with funding for the awards to be secured from stalwart supporters such as the Hamilton and Region Guild, and new supporter of the exhibition, the Waterloo Potters' Workshop. There were requests regarding grants such as letters of recommendation for our affiliate guilds and proofreading of applications written from within FUSION, (all successful so far as I've heard to date which is good news for all of us!)

With exciting new programs such as the Mentorship Program, I wrote a letter outlining our current programs that was sent out to ~500 former members entitled "Baby Come Back! (to FUSION)". Some of you may have received it, if so, welcome back! It netted some interesting responses and renewals which is also always good news for everyone.

I continue to assist Susan Card with the organization of the Annual Conference and Workshops: proofreading that fantastic poster that she and Derek Chung put together each year with a million pieces of information in it, getting the conference pin made (this year in the likeness of one of Audrey Killoran's amazing pots), seeing to all the artists' needs on stage in concert with Ian Chung from Tucker's Pottery Supplies, and miscellaneous go-fer jobs during the weekend itself. It's always a pleasure to work with all of the above and the other board members and conference volunteers each year.

Looking back on the 2010/2011 year at FUSION, I am once again struck by the optimism and determination with which the current board members approach every job. We are all very lucky to have this group, some of them very recent additions, continuing their work on our behalf.

This is the last FUSION Annual Report I anticipate writing as I step down from the board as of this weekend. My close involvement with the board (if not always actually "on" it) dates back to 1996. 1. Nature of organization

FUSION: The Ontario Clay and Glass Association (the "Association" or "FUSION") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated in 1975 under the laws of the Province of Ontario without share capital, and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act.

The Association's mandate is to encourage and promote quality in clay and glass and to provide educational resources and community based programming.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles, the more significant of which are outlined below.

Accounting estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Short-term investments

Short-term investments consist of money market funds and are recorded at cost. Short-term investments are written down where there has been a loss in value of an investment that is other than temporary. The market value of the short-term investments at year end is \$70,979 (2009 - \$90,761).

Equipment

Equipment is recorded at cost and is being amortized over its estimated useful life on a declining balance basis. The annual amortization rates are as follows:

Office equipment	20%
Computer equipment and software	45%

Pottery collection

The pottery collection is recorded at cost and represents the Association's collection of over 100 pieces of art works from shows.

Revenue recognition

Membership fees, grants, publication and merchandise sales are recorded as revenue in the fiscal year to which they relate. Fees or grants received in advance are recorded as deferred revenue.

Fees from activities are recorded as revenue in the period in which the activity occurs.

Contributed services

Volunteers contribute a substantial number of hours during the year to assist the Association in carrying out its mandate. Because of the difficulty in determining the fair market value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies — continued

Financial instruments

The Association's financial instruments are comprised of cash, short-term investments, accounts receivable, accounts payable and note payable.

The carrying value of the Association's cash, short-term investments, accounts receivable, accounts payable and note payable approximates fair value due to their short-term maturities.

Unless otherwise noted, it is management's opinion that the Association is not exposed to significant interest, currency, or credit risks arising from financial instruments.

Management of capital

FUSION's capital is comprised of the net assets invested in equipment, internally restricted net assets and unrestricted net assets.

Invested in equipment

FUSION invests in equipment in order to provide programming that assists its members. The Board of Directors (the "Board") is responsible for this investment and defines the policies to be followed in ensuring the smooth functioning of the Association's physical environment.

Internally restricted net assets

The Board has imposed an internal restriction on net assets which may be allocated to awards, capital or to fund contingencies for future operations.

Unrestricted net assets

The Board's objective is to maintain an unrestricted net assets balance sufficient to meet the day to day working capital requirements. Management prepares the annual budget which projects the unrestricted net assets balance required. After the budget is approved by the Board, the Treasurer monitors the actual results against the budget and notifies the Board when changes to plans are required.

Future accounting standards

The Accounting Standards Board has issued the new accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations for fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2012, with early adoption permitted. The Association does not expect the impact of the new standards to be significant.

4. Arts Endowment Fund

An Arts Endowment Fund (the "Fund") is held by the Ontario Arts Council Foundation in perpetuity on the Association's behalf. The amounts are invested in pooled funds within the Fund's own portfolio which is managed by Burgundy Asset Management and Letko Brosseau. The Association is only entitled to the annual income generated from the Fund to spend on its operations. Income received from the Fund during the year amounted to \$2,711 (2010 - \$Nil) and the market value of the Fund at year end was \$58,701.

5. Lease commitment

The Association has a lease commitment with respect to its premises until October 31, 2012. The minimum lease payments required, excluding operating costs, will be \$8,000 for fiscal 2012 and \$4,700 for 2013.

6. Comparative amounts

Certain comparative amounts have been reclassified from those previously presented to conform to the presentation of the 2011 financial statements.
