Re: Extension to Complete Deficiencies, <u>Port LaJoie, 125 Sydney Street, City</u>

Consideration has been given to your request for an extension of a three (3) month period in which to complete the deficiencies (proper mechanical ventilation in the public washrooms), due to your present lease being for another three months only and due to a proposed major rental increase which will result in the Club possibly seeking alternate accommodations.

The Division is prepared to tolerate the above mentioned deficiencies providing a commitment is made by the Executive, in writing, within fifteen (15) days that should the present quarters be retained, proper ventilation will immediately be installed within the public washroom and that the washrooms will be upgraded prior to April, 1981, to meet minimum requirements of the Eating Establishment and Licensed Premises Regulations.

Should, however, the Club seek alternate quarters, the Division would require a floor plan of the proposed quarters and an Approval Certificate from this Division would be required prior to the Club re-opening.
