1.1. INTRODUCTION

Forum Research was commissioned to conduct a survey of Canadians covering topics important to the Privy Council Office and the Government of Canada. The survey topics included Canadians perceptions and opinions relevant to the Canadian population. This report addresses the methodological details of the study pertaining to the time period between January 8, 2018 and March 27, 2018. This is the fourth of four reports that will be submitted under this contract.

1.2. RESEARCH PURPOSE

The purpose of this study is to provide the Privy Council Office with information pertaining to the perceptions and opinions of Canadians regarding a number of topics. The Privy Council Office serves three main roles in serving Canada and Canadians:

- To provide non-partisan advice to the Prime Minister, portfolio ministers, Cabinet and Cabinet committees on matters of national and international importance
- To support the smooth functioning of the Cabinet decision-making process and facilitate the implementation of the Government's agenda
- To foster a high-performing and accountable Public Service

1.3. RESEARCH OBJECTIVES

The primary research objectives of this study include:

- Tracking public opinion regarding the most critical matters across Canada
- Assessment of Canadians' insight regarding how to best approach current challenges
- Determination of what the public believes should be acted upon most urgently
- Measuring public perception as it relates to how the government can best market its ongoing commitment to addressing current/pressing challenges
- Historical trending of weekly results to showcase any fluctuations in public opinion

1.4. OVERALL APPROACH

The Privy Council Office provided specific requirements for conducting the survey in its request for proposals. The survey was conducted using the computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI) methodology and was administered in both official languages to the Canadian population.

1.5. QUESTIONNAIRE DESIGN

The Privy Council Office provided Forum Research with a draft version of the questionnaire. The questionnaire was modified on a weekly basis (upon request of the Privy Council Office) to reflect the dynamic nature of important topics affecting Canadians. Forum Research worked with the Privy Council Office project team to review the questionnaire, with specific attention to question wording, ordering, and the overall flow of the survey. The survey was pre-tested on a weekly basis (Saturdays and Sundays) before data collection (Monday to Friday) upon request from the Privy Council Office. The weekly pre-tests aimed to achieve 20 completes, with 10 administered in French and 10 administered in English. The pre-tests were available for live monitoring by the Privy Council Office, and recordings of the



interviews were shared with the Privy Council Office, when requested. A thorough review of the survey flow, logic, and questionnaire design was conducted by both Forum Research and the Privy Council Office.

1.6. SAMPLE DESIGN

Using computer assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) and random digit dialing (RDD), Forum Research sampled landlines (48%) and cell phones (52%) and attained an average weekly sample of n = 500.

1.7. WEIGHTING

Forum applied a weighting strategy (using 2016 Statistics Canada Census data) which is balanced according to:

- Age
- Gender
- Region

Weighting was conducted at the end of each weekly data collection period with the data collected during the week. As the data files were cumulative, data that was previously weighted was not reweighted.

1.8. GENERALIZATION OF DATA

The weekly sample can be extrapolated to the Canadian population within a margin of error of \pm 4.38%, 19 times out of 20. The data was collected using a random sampling approach, and weighted according to Statistics Canada data (2016). As such, this data is of the highest possible quality and accurately reflects (within the MoE) Canadians' opinions.

1.9. RESEARCH OUTCOMES

The findings of the research are expected to be used to inform the Government of Canada about Canadians opinions regarding important national and international topics.



2. QUARTERLY METHODOLOGICAL REPORT

2.1. INTRODUCTION

Forum Research was commissioned to conduct a survey of Canadians covering topics important to the Privy Council Office and the Government of Canada. The survey topics included Canadians perceptions and opinions relevant to the Canadian population. This report addresses the methodological details of the study pertaining to the time period between January 8, 2018 and March 27, 2018. 2.2. RESEARCH PURPOSE

The purpose of this study is to provide the Privy Council Office with information pertaining to the perceptions and opinions of Canadians regarding a number of topics. The Privy Council Office serves three main roles in serving Canada and Canadians:

- To provide non-partisan advice to the Prime Minister, portfolio ministers, Cabinet and Cabinet committees on matters of national and international importance
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interviews were shared with the Privy Council Office, when requested. A thorough review of the survey flow, logic, and questionnaire design was conducted by both Forum Research and the Privy Council Office.

2.6. PRE-TESTING

Survey pre-testing was conducted on weekends in order to assess a number of metrics of the data collection prior to launch, when requested. When pre-tests were conducted, a pre-test report was filled out by trained staff and was sent to the Privy Council Office on the following Monday of each week. A sample of the pre-test report is shown in Appendix A.

2.7. SAMPLE DESIGN AND SELECTION

Using computer assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) and random digit dialing (RDD), a probability-based sampling method was conducted. Forum Research sampled landlines and cell phones and attained a weekly sample of 500 Canadians. All Canadian area codes were included, including those from the territories. Eligible respondents were restricted to those over the age of 18. A soft quota of 48% landline and 52% cellphone for each weekly sample was the target, however, the proportion of landline vs. cellphone was deemed acceptable within the margin of error. The quotas for landline and cellphone were established in order to ensure that the younger populations were sufficiently sampled.



2.8. QUARTERLY SAMPLE METRICS

2.9. WEIGHTING PROCEDURES

Forum applied a weighting strategy (using 2016 Stats Can data) which is balanced according to:

- Age
- Gender
- Region

Weighting was conducted at the end of each weekly data collection period with the data collected during the week. As the data files were cumulative, data that was previously weighted was not reweighted.

2.10. MARGIN OF ERROR & CONFIDENCE INTERVAL

The target weekly sample of 500 Canadians results in an overall margin of error of \pm 4.38%, 19 times out of 20.

2.11. RESPONSE RATE

Response rates were calculated using the procedures as outlined in the MRIA response rate calculation guidelines. The disposition records and aggregate response rates are shown below. An aggregate response rate was calculated to be equal to 1.13%.

2.12. SURVEY ADMINISTRATION

The survey was administered between January 8, 2018 and March 27, 2018 (as shown in the Table below) using the computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI) methodology and was administered in both the official languages. It was conducted from Forum's Toronto and Montreal call centers by a team of experienced bilingual interviewers and supervising staff. The interviewers were selected and trained by full-time training staff. Each interviewer completed a rigorous three-day, 15-hour "basic training" class.

2.13. CALL TIMES

Forum Research collected data on weekdays and weekends. Pre-tests were conducted weekends upon request from the Privy Council Office. Calls were made on Saturdays between 10:00am and 6:00pm, and on Sundays at 12:00pm and 6:00pm. Primary data collection was conducted from Monday to Friday between the hours of 5pm to 9pm local time.

2.14. CALL BACKS

Forum Research restricted the number of call backs to 8 calls for landlines and 5 calls for cellphones. Furthermore, Respondents were not called back after two weeks from their initial call. Call-backs were made at varying days and times in order to maximize the proportion of successful call-backs.



2.15. GENERALIZATION OF DATA

The findings can be extrapolated to the Canadian population within a margin of error of \pm 4.38%. The data was collected using a random sampling approach, and weighted according to Statistics Canada data (2016). As such, this data is of the highest possible quality and accurately reflects (within the MoE) Canadians' opinions. Sampling error is just one source of potential error, and best practices were used in order to reduce the influence of other sources of error, such as non-sampling error. Measures were taken in order to reduce the influence of non-response bias, such as item and unit non-response. In order to reduce the influence of item non-response bias, all interviewers were trained to effectively deliver high quality interviews in a professional and ethical manner. Respondents were assured their answers remain anonymous and confidential, thus reducing the likelihood of item non-response.

A number of measures and procedure were taken to reduce the influence of unit non-response on the data. In order to achieve a representative sample of youth, a larger proportion of cell phones were sampled (52%) in comparison to landlines (48%). To increase sample representativeness, fieldwork was conducted throughout the week and on weekends, to account for varying work schedules. Call-backs were made to ensure that individuals who were interested in participating-but were unavailable-would still be able to do so at their convenience. Finally, to ensure a representative sample, the data was weighted using 2016 Statistics Canada data on three demographic variables; *Age, Gender*, and *Region*.

The following table shows comparisons between three variables in the survey sample with their equivalent parameters in the population as made available from Statistics Canada. The parameters were obtained from the most recent Statistics Canada Census (2016). In order to maximize comparability, refusals were excluded from the sample statistic calculations.
