At long last we have our first issue for 2009 assembled and printed! You will also find the penultimate instance of Rosaleen's regular column about singing versions of the Child ballads; she is now in "mop up" mode, but it looks as though there will be enough items left for one more piece in the series. John Leeder's column, "Treasures from our Archives," is here as usual, and he and others have contributed various CD and book reviews. At the end of this issue you will also find a Cumulative Index for Volume 42 (2008).
