Congenital dislocation	Osteoarthritis
Postseptic arthritis	Rheumatoid arthritis
Legg-Calvé-Perthes disease	Trauma
Slipped femoral capital epiphysis	"Battered knee syndrome"
Trauma:	Multiple epiphyseal dysplasia
• Fractures of the femoral neck, femoral head or acetabulum	Spondyloepiphyseal dysplasia
• Dislocations of the hip joint	Osteochondrodystrophies (e.g., achondroplasia and pseudo-achondroplasia)
Osteoarthritis	Developmental conditions:
Rheumatoid arthritis	• Blount's disease
Ankylosing spondylitis	• Trevor's disease
Seronegative spondyloarthropathies	Osteochondritis dissecans
Avascular necrosis of the femoral head	Hemophilic arthropathy
Multiple epiphyseal dysplasia	Seronegative spondyloarthropathies
Spondyloepiphyseal dysplasia	Spontaneous osteonecrosis of the knee
