- Number of Christmas tree farms in Canada: 4077
- Number of trees produced annually on these farms: 4.5 million
- Total cash receipts from Canada's Christmas tree industry, 1999: \$71 million
- Weight of press releases received by *CMAJ's* news and features editor from Jan. 1 to Nov. 9, 2000: 78 pounds (35.5 kg)
- Distance covered by the 950 000-plus patient files stored at University Hospital, Laval, Que.: 6 to 7 km
 - Thickest file: 21 folders

- Number of calories a 180-lb person would have to ingest daily to match the caloric intake of a hummingbird: 204 300
 - Proportion of Canadian men who are obese: 35.2%
 - Proportion of women: 25.8%
- Proportion of Canadians who believe their nutritional habits could improve: 39%
- Total value of snack foods (potato chips, etc.) shipped by Canadian snack-food manufacturers in a year: \$1 billion
 - Total value of Canadian greenhouse vegetable production, 1996: \$221 million
 - Per capita consumption of cranberries (processed and fresh) in Canada, 1966: 0.11 kg
 - In 1996: 0.76 kg
- Proportion of Canadian students accessing the Internet from school: 78%
 - Proportion of US students: 59%
 - Proportion of students in urban China: 13%
- Estimated number of Internet users worldwide, April 2000: 300 million
- Number of Internet users worldwide who have made purchases online: 120 million
 - Proportion of Canadian Internet users worried about releasing personal information when they make online purchases: 80%
- Number of units of blood required to treat the average gunshot wound: 15
 - For heart bypass surgery: 1 to 6
 - For brain aneurysms: 4
- Annual loss to Canada's economy from unintentional injuries: \$8.7 billion
 - Loss due to health care costs: \$4.2 billion
 - Due to lost workplace productivity: \$4.5 billion
- Proportion of Canadian parents who consider their homes to be childproof: 91%
- Proportion of same parents who do not lock up potentially deadly household cleaning products: 55%
- Proportion of Canadians who take nutritional supplements to avoid illness: 63%
- Proportion of Canadians who, given the opportunity, would like to live forever: 24%
- Proportion of men who would take a drug to double their lifespan, despite serious side effects: 14%
 - Proportion of women who would take the drug: 6%
