# ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Prior to University of Manitoba admission, all applicants must demonstrate a command of English. An applicant whose primary language is not English, or whose previous education has been conducted in another language, must demonstrate a competence in the English language sufficient to meet the demands of classroom instruction, written assignments and participation in tutorials and discussions in English. A variety of standardized English tests are acceptable to meet the English requirement.

- For the TOEFL, a score of 550 (PBT) with a minimum of 50 in each component, 213 (CBT) with a minimum of 17 in each component, or 80 (iBT) with minimum of 19 in each component is required.
- For the IELTS Academic Module, a score of 6.5 is required.

# ELC (ENGLISH LANGUAGE CENTRE)

A unique conditional acceptance program through the English Language Centre (ELC), prepares students for admission to undergraduate programs at the University of Manitoba and can be used to satisfy the English language requirement instead of a specific grade on a standardized English test (such as TOEFL). The ELC focuses strictly on English for academic purposes and runs three 14 week terms a year, with intake in September, January, and May. There are also special English programs and part-time courses to help students in degree programs continue to refine their English skills.

International student entrance scholarships are available to all international high school graduates who apply directly from high school and demonstrate the equivalent of at least an 85% average on their senior year high school courses. These scholarships are valued between \$800 and \$2000 each. Students who receive admission are automatically considered for these scholarships.

International students are eligible for in-house awards after they begin their studies at the University of Manitoba.

Financial need-based assistance is also available to eligible full-time undergraduate international students to assist with second term tuition fees.


