Grants-in-Aid 1995
Folklore Research, Collection & Publication

Applications are invited by the Helen Creighton Foundation for Grants-in-Aid to scholars, researchers, museums and archives for projects relating to folklore research, collection and publication.

These grants are intended to provide encouragement for research or publication projects. They can contribute to research equipment, field trip projects, or editing and illustrating material about to be published. They can also assist researchers by offering professional assessments, thereby strengthening the applicant's position in larger competitions.

The Foundation operates on a limited budget, but with more support these grants may be increased in subsequent years. The aim is to assist as many individuals and institutions as possible with our limited resources.

Grants are normally for \$250, with the possibility of renewal. A few larger grants may be made. Announcements will be made by May 15. A few awards will be reserved for Fall requests.

Applicants who are still students should provide a transcript, two letters from academic supervisors, and a prospectus and budget for their project. Scholars and experienced researchers should provide a CV, one supporting letter from a peer, a prospectus and budget.

Archival and museum administrators should outline how their proposal relates to an on-going program of collection, cataloguing or indexing of their materials.
