WHO ARE WE?

The **Client Services and Marketing Unit** will guide you through the Agriculture Statistical Program and will help you with your data needs, whether they are customized or semi-customized services.

The **Census of Agriculture Section** provides detailed information on the structure of the farm sector and the geographic location of agricultural production. It also provides the basis for most agriculture surveys and data series.

The date for the release of all farm variables from the 1996 Census of Agriculture was May 14, 1997. Farm operator data were released on December 15, 1997. Data from the 1996 Census of Agriculture-Population Linkage Database were released on April 26, 1999.

The **Farm Income and Prices Section** produces estimates of farm cash receipts by item, farm expenses by item, depreciation, farm product price index, net farm income, assets and liabilities.

The **Whole Farm Data Projects Section** provides a complete set of physical and financial data at the farm level. These data include detailed revenues and expenses, operator and family off-farm income, crop acreages, livestock numbers, capital investment and sales, assets and liabilities by size and type of farm for subprovincial regions.

The **Crops Section** produces estimates of field crops, horticultural crops and grain marketing statistics.

The **Livestock and Animal Products Section** produces data on livestock, dairy, poultry and eggs, furs, aquaculture, and other animal products as well as data on food consumption in Canada.

Spatial Analysis and Geomatics Applications provides information to clients on crop conditions, crop area, land-use change and related agriculture and environmental applications by analyzing satellite and spatial data and conducting research and development.

The **Research and Rural Data Section** produces analytical papers related to Canadian rural and small town issues.

The Analysis Unit produces analytical papers on the Canadian agri-food sector, including related environmental and health issues.

The **Informatics Section** provides internal computer services.

The Agriculture Division has developed a number of products which are suitable for the classroom setting and can be used in a variety of subject areas including social studies, geography, science and history. They combine data, graphics and visuals to give students an interesting perspective on Canadian agriculture. Look for the symbols below to identify educational products or Internet products.

CENSUS OF AGRICULTURE

Statistics Canada conducts the Census of Agriculture every five years in conjunction with the Census of Population. The Census of Agriculture provides detailed information on the structure of the farm sector and the geographic location of agricultural production. It also provides the basis for most agriculture surveys and data series.

The 1996 Census of Agriculture provides data on the number of farms, crop areas, livestock counts, expenses, receipts, land use, machinery and equipment inventories and capital purchases. It also provides data on the number of farm operators, their age and sex, type of work done and the operation of non-agricultural businesses.

When these data are combined with data from the Census of Population, the result is the Agriculture-Population Linkage Database. This unique base paints a socio-economic portrait not only of farm operators but of their spouses, children, families and households.

The next Census of Agriculture will take place on May 15, 2001. Data from the 2001 Census of Agriculture will begin to be available May 2002. Watch next year's People, Products and Services for more details. Products and services from the 1996 Census of Agriculture are still available.

1996 Census of Agriculture CD-ROM (93F0031XCB)





Data for all farm operator characteristics at the national and provincial levels and selected farm data for the Yukon and Northwest Territories are also included.

Selected data from the 1996 Agriculture-Population Linkage Database such as marital status, mother tongue, highest level of schooling, income and other socio-economic characteristics of farm operators and farm families are also available on this CD-ROM. This product also contains historical farm population counts as well as other selected historical data from previous Censuses of Agriculture and Agriculture-Population Linkage databases at the national and provincial levels.

Historical Overview of Canadian Agriculture (93-358-XPB)



This publication is an updated and expanded version of the very popular historical publication introduced in 1991. It presents basic counts, totals, percentage changes and percent distributions for an expanded set of variables at the Canada and provincial levels for the 1976, 1981, 1986, 1991 and 1996 Censuses of Agriculture. Two new sections have been added for 1996: the first presents 75 years of Census of Agriculture data (1921 to 1996) for selected variables and the second highlights the change between 1991 and 1996 in the series of land management practices, variable introduced in 1991.

Agricultural Profiles

The Canada publication presents a group of area profile tables at the Canada and province levels and two additional tables which present selected variables cross-classified by gross farm receipts and farm type at the Canada level. Also included are selected data for the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

The seven remaining publications present area profile tables for all farm variables at the province, Census Agricultural Region and Census Division levels. Three additional tables include: a small area table with selected variables tabulated at the Census Division and Census Consolidated Subdivision levels and two cross-classified tables at the province level.

Each publication contains reference maps that identify the location of all geographic areas tabulated.

Profile of Canadian Farm Operators (93-359-XPB)

This new publication presents Canada and province level data on farm operator characteristics from the 1996 Census of Agriculture questionnaire (e.g. types of work done, operation of non-agricultural businesses, farm related injuries) and selected agricultural variables (e.g. farm type, gross farm receipts) cross-classified by the number of operators per farm as well as the age and sex of farm operators. Historical comparison tables displaying the changes that occurred between the 1991 and 1996 Censuses of Agriculture are also included.

FARM FINANCIAL STATISTICS

he Agriculture Division produces a variety of statistics on the financial viability of Canadian farms. Data on farm expenses, receipts, prices, assets and liabilities are available as standard and custom products.

FARM INCOME AND PRICES

The Farm Income and Prices Section integrates a wide variety of physical and financial data from a range of internal and external government and private sources to produce financial accounts for the agriculture sector for use in the System of National Accounts and for many other users. The following annual estimates are published at the provincial level:

- net farm income
- farm cash receipts by commodity
- farm operating expenses by item and depreciation charges
- direct program payments by program
- value of farm capital by major component
- farm debt oustanding by type of lender
- farm product price index
- farm business cash flow statement
- the production (value added) account
- balance sheets of the agricultural sector

Estimates on farm cash receipts, by commodity, and direct program payments, by program, are also published on a quarterly basis at the provincial level.

WHOLE FARM DATA BASE

Meeting Evolving Needs of Users

The Whole Farm Data Base (WFDB) is the product of a joint venture between Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada and Statistics Canada. It was developed with the intention to meet the increasing demands by users of agricultural statistics for more disaggregated data at the whole farm level. There are various potential users, from public sector policy-makers, to industry analysts and private sector decision-makers. The WFDB provides the means for users to evaluate agricultural policies and programs as well as analyze the viability, stability, and competitiveness of various farm businesses.

All the Information in a Single Base

Regrouping into one base the agricultural data, which are available from administrative and survey sources, is the essence of the WFDB. While committed to reducing response burden, eliminating duplication and maximizing the use of existing resources, the WFDB can offer users access to a wider than ever range of disaggregated physical and financial data at the farm level. The ultimate objective of this base is to provide a set of data at the whole farm level, that is as complete as possible to produce disaggregated statistics by farm type, revenue class and subprovincial geographic regions.

Whole Farm Data Base Structure

There are five major data sources currently offered on the WFDB: the **Taxation Data Program (TDP)** 1987-present, the **National Farm Survey (NFS)** 1988-1992, the **June Crops Survey (JCS)** 1993-present, the **July Livestock Survey (JLS)** 1993-present, and the **Farm Financial Survey (FFS)** every two years since 1988.

CUSTOM SERVICES

The Whole Farm Data Base (WFDB) provides custom tabulations of physical and financial farm data at the whole farm level. This allows one to obtain detailed farm revenue and expenditure data, sources and level of off-farm income for farm operators and farm families, assets, liabilities and capital investment data, and estimates on land use and livestock inventories - based on specialized needs. All these variables can be disaggregated by farm type, revenue class and subprovincial area. Although the WFDB can be used to produce estimates for selected domains regardless of the revenue level, the base is primarily structured to provide data for farms with reported revenues of \$10,000 and over.

The WFDB can provide estimates for every variable collected on all data sources. However, for reasons of quality and consistency, a specific series of agricultural variables in a standard output format has been devised for each source. Once combined, these series create a comprehensive set of physical and financial data at the whole farm level. The variables selected from each source are complementary, thus providing more thorough coverage of the agricultural sector on an annual basis. Interested clients are encouraged to refer to the **WFDB** - **Reference Manual (Statistics Canada catalogue no. 21F0005GPE), available free of charge**. Data are available in most required formats (paper or electronic (21C0005GIE): diskette/E-Mail in ASCII, CSV, Lotus file, etc.)

Taxation Data Program (TDP)

Data are derived annually from a sample of incorporated and unincorporated taxation returns from Canada Customs and Revenue Agency. Data are available for itemized revenues, expenses, and acquisitions and dispositions of depreciable assets. Also available are sources and levels of farm and off-farm income for operators and unincorporated farm families. Available by subprovincial region, farm type and revenue class. Historical data are available back to 1987.

June Crop Survey (JCS)

Estimates from an annual survey of farmers include detailed cropland acreages. Available by subprovincial region, farm type and revenue class starting in 1993.

July Livestock Survey (JLS)

Estimates from an annual survey of farmers include detailed livestock inventories. Available by subprovincial region, farm type and revenue class starting in 1993.

National Farm Survey (NFS)

Estimates from an annual survey of farmers include detailed cropland acreages and livestock inventories. Available by subprovincial region, farm type and revenue class from 1988 to 1992.

Farm Financial Survey (FFS)

Estimates from a biennial survey of farmers include detailed balance sheet information, capital investment and capital sales. Available by subprovincial region, farm type and revenue class starting in 1987.

SPATIAL ANALYSIS AND GEOMATICS APPLICATIONS (SAGA)

The Spatial Analysis and Geomatics Applications (Section SAGA) provides a variety of products and services using the tools and methodologies of digital image analysis (remote sensing) and geographic information systems (GIS). The program includes operational agricultural and environmental applications, custom mapping, satellite image analysis and geomatics services. These remote sensing and geostatistical products and services are available on a cost-recovery or fee-for-services basis.

AGRICULTURAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMOTE SENSING / GIS APPLICATIONS

The SAGA team has considerable experience and expertise in developing operational remote sensing and integrated geographic information processing applications. The data and products generated by SAGA are available to clients as hard-copy maps or in electronic formats. Some major SAGA application programs include:

- The **Crop Condition Assessment Program** (**CCAP**) is a near-real time, value-added product that is available via the Internet. Throughout the agricultural growing season, the CCAP provides weekly crop condition analysis of western Canada based on the low-resolution digital satellite data. This subscription service produces timely, quantitative and objective crop condition information at the provincial, census agricultural region, township and rural municipality levels. The weekly interactive information package includes colour images and maps, graphs, tables and an experimental spring wheat **yield model**.
- The Prince Edward Island Land Cover Classification and Forest Monitoring Project (PLCCP). Since 1995, SAGA has conducted an annual operational land-resource and forest management project for the Department of Agriculture and Forestry (DAF), Prince Edward Island. Using digital remote sensing and geographic information system (GIS) technologies, multi-date, high-resolution satellite data are digitally processed providing land-cover data in electronic format of major crops, forest type, forest cutovers, urban areas and water classes throughout Prince Edward Island. Project outputs are incorporated by DAF into a GIS to support several provincial operational programs and research initiatives. Results of this project have clearly demonstrated the value of using high-resolution digital satellite data integrated with a GIS for the provision of land-resource management information in a timely, accurate and cost-efficient manner.
- Canadian Agriculture at a Glance: Customized Mapping Applications. SAGA prepared all of the maps published in Canadian Agriculture at a Glance (96-325-XPB). All maps are in full colour and available in either paper or electronic format. Standard and custom mapping services are provided by SAGA to clients on a routine basis.
- **Digital Boundary Files:** Agricultural Ecumene of Canada, 1996. This digital boundary file delineates areas of significant agricultural activity in Canada based on the 1996 Census of Agriculture data. An agricultural ecumene is used for displaying agricultural data and limits data presentation to recognized areas of agricultural significance. The 1996 agricultural ecumene was delineated to represent data at the census division level of geography. Ecumene pockets exist in all census divisions for which data are published by the Census of Agriculture. Where data have been suppressed for confidentiality reasons, ecumene pockets in these census divisions have been eliminated. Data collected from census farms are

reported in the ecumene pocket of a neighbouring census division. A list of geographic amalgamations can be obtained by contacting User Services, Census of Agriculture.

• **Digital Boundary Files:** *Census Agricultural Region (CAR).* A census agricultural region is a subprovincial geographic area used by the Census of Agriculture for disseminating agricultural statistics. In all provinces except Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan, a census agricultural region is a contiguous grouping of census divisions. In Saskatchewan, census agricultural regions are groupings of adjacent census consolidated subdivisions, but these groupings do not necessarily respect census division boundaries. Census agricultural regions have not been defined for Prince Edward Island, the Yukon, the Northwest Territories or Nunavut. In the Prairies, census agricultural regions are commonly referred to as crop districts.

Ongoing research and development is an important component of the SAGA program. As with the custom mapping and spatial data analysis programs, outputs of SAGA's research and development efforts are often available to its clients. Current projects include:

- early season forecast of western Canada's spring wheat yield using NOAA digital satellite data
- land-use and land-use change analysis from high-resolution digital satellite imagery
- geographic information database design and implementation
- use of satellite remote sensing for construction of statistical area sampling frames (ASF)
- the use of digital radar satellite data for land-use and crop monitoring
- geostatistical integration of database software/hardware systems



CANSIM DATA BASE

CANSIM is Statistics Canada's corporate computerized data base network and information retrieval service. In total the CANSIM Time Series Database contains over 1 million time series collected from subject matter sources throughout Statistics Canada and from outside sources such as the Bank of Canada. Currently 21,000 time series from Agriculture Division are on CANSIM.

On-Line Access to CANSIM

Complete sets or subsets of the CANSIM Time Series Database are available to the private and public sectors from various commercial service bureaus under license to Statistics Canada. CANSIM is also accessible on the Statistics Canada Internet site at http://www.statcan.ca.

CANSIM University Base

The entire CANSIM University Time Series Database is available to university and college subscribers via Internet delivery from a university distributor. Use of the database is restricted to educational institutions for the purposes of teaching and academic research. Most of the 21,000 agriculture time series are also available through the University Base Internet service.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE INFORMATION

Statistics Canada has information on all commodities imported into or exported out of Canada. Every year more than 20 million import and export documents are processed. The information collected is used to produce the official database of Canada's international trade.

Every month data are produced on the quantity and value of more than 18,000 commodities coming from, or destined to, over 200 countries. They can be used to determine market shares, identify foreign and domestic market trends, monitor Canada's trading status, examine transportation implications, and monitor price and volume of traded goods. Monthly, quarterly or annual data are provided at the most detailed level or aggregated to provide a broad picture. Trade data are compiled, analyzed and released 12 times a year. Data for a given month are, on average, available just 50 days after the end of the reference period.

DATA PRODUCTS

World Trade Atlas® - Canada Edition (WTA-CE)

The World Trade Atlas® - Canada Edition is a new data and software product from the International Trade Division of Statistics Canada and Global Trade Information Services Inc.. It contains Canada's trade activity with the rest of the world.

ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION SYSTEM

The Environmental Information System contains a wide variety of Statistics Canada socio-economic data series commonly used in analysis of environmental issues. This information can be restructured to suit specific needs of the environmental researcher or consultant. To date, the system has been used by researchers

to estimate pollution emission levels; analyze pollutants from agriculture; gauge population pressures on ecosystems; assess land use change; estimate acid rain impacts; and to help estimate soil erosion.

A number of special geographic units are available, including river basins, ecological zones, soil zones, and wetland regions. For example, clients have been provided with socio-economic data tabulated for acid rain deposition zones, endangered species habitats, air pollution monitoring areas, and forest regions, among others.

Over 1,000 demographic, agriculture and manufacturing variables collected by Statistics Canada are maintained on the information system. Examples of these data include population and population change; dwelling characteristics; household facilities; agricultural land uses; agricultural cropping practices, fertilizer and pesticide use; industrial characteristics and activities.

GEOGRAPHY PRODUCTS AND SERVICES

The Geography Division maintains a spatially referenced geographic database in support of the Censuses of Population and Agriculture, the *Standard Geographical Classification* and other Statistics Canada Programmes. The division also develops geographical concepts, delineates geographic areas, produces maps and other published reference materials, produces files on diskette and CD-ROM, and offers a variety of custom services.

GEOGRAPHY REFERENCE PRODUCTS

GeoSuite is a data retrieval and tabular output tool. It provides the 1996 population and dwelling counts for most geographic areas excluding postal code, and all of the geographic reference information that a Census data user will require, such as geographic codes and names. It also allows clients to explore the links between all standard levels of geography. The 1996 GeoSuite includes additional information previously available in other separate products which are no longer being produced, such as the correspondence between enumeration areas (EA) from the 1996 and 1991 Censuses (EA correspondence), reference lists of component enumeration areas for higher geographic levels (EA Reference lists), as well as the enumeration area reference map titles to facilitate the identification of the appropriate maps for a given standard geographic area.

Postal Codes Counts, 1996 Census - is a new product for 1996 that contains population and dwellings counts for all six character postal codes reported by respondents. The population and dwelling counts are provided by individual postal code, by forward sortation area (FSA - the first three characters of the six-character postal code) and by province or territory. The data are provided with Windows-based software that enables users to perform simple data manipulations such as searching the data set for specific postal codes, importing groups of postal codes for which counts are required and exporting groupings of postal codes. Documentation and reference material are contained in electronic form on the CD-ROM.

Reference Maps identify Census geographic areas and locate their boundaries, allowing clients to relate Census data to actual physical locations on the ground. The following reference maps are available for the 1996 Census:

- Census Division/Census Subdivision
- Census Metropolitan Area/Census Agglomeration/Census Tract
- Federal Electoral District/Enumeration Area
- Enumeration Area maps for Large Urban centres, Small Urban centres and Rural areas

The Standard Geographical Classification (SGC) - is a system of names and codes representing areas of Canada. It consists of a three-tiered hierarchy - province, county and municipality. The SGC is used to identify information for particular geographical areas and to tabulate statistics.

The 1996 SGC, which replaces the 1991 version as the official geographical classification of Statistics Canada, is organized into two volumes.

Standard Geographical Classification. Volume I. The Classification (12-571-XPB) - is designed as a reference and coding manual. The Classification volume contains tables of SGC units with their names and codes and an alphabetical index of place names. It also covers related areas based upon the SGC.

Standard Geographical Classification. Volume II. Reference Maps (12-572-XPB) - shows the boundaries, names and codes of SGC areas.

The SGC is produced and maintained by Standards Division of Statistics Canada.

PUBLICATIONS

A single publication called **A National Overview Population and Dwelling Counts** (93-357-XPB) is available for the 1996 Census. It contains population and dwelling count data for all standard geographic areas except enumeration areas, census tracts and six-character postal codes.

The 1996 Census Dictionary (92-351-UIE) contains an appendix called "A Guide to Census Geography and Applications" which explains the standard hierarchies of Statistics Canada's geographic areas and includes several examples of applications using geography products and services. This publication is available to download free from the Internet (http://www.statcan.ca).

Interim List of Changes to Municipal Boundaries, Status and Names - provides summary of changes to municipal boundaries, status and names. The list is produced on an annual basis for changes that occurred during the previous year. The interim list is available in hard copy or on diskette.

The **Geography Working Paper Series** is intended to stimulate discussion on a variety of topics covering conceptual, methodological or technical work to support the development and dissemination of the division's data, products and services. Individual working papers, catalogue no. 92F0138MIE, are available to download free from the Internet (http://www.statcan.ca). Paper versions, catalogue no. 92F0138MPE, are available for a small fee.

ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS

Digital Boundary Files (DBF) and Digital Cartographic Files (DCF): These files comprise a series of digital geographic boundaries for all levels of geography from provinces and territories down to enumeration areas. The Digital Cartographic Files are Digital Boundary Files with shoreline and a water layer added for thematic mapping and display.

Street Network Files (SNF): These are digital files representing the street network for most large urban centres in Canada. The 1996 SNF will have streets and addresses updated to reflect the information collected on Census Day - May 14, 1996.

Skeletal Street Network Files (SSNF): These are "thinned out" Street Network Files containing selected major streets and other features that are used to define census tract boundaries. SSNFs are produced solely to provide some cartographic reference features when producing thematic maps with Digital Cartographic Files.

The Street Network and Feature Extension Files (SNFEFs): Are digital files that extended the coverage of the Street Network Files (SNFs) to the defined limits of the census metropolitan areas / census agglomeration (CMA/CA). The SNFEFs contain all the features of the SNFs plus a road and feature network from the National Topographic Data Base (NTDB) extending from the SNF coverage to the CMA/CA limit.

Block-face Data File (BFDF): A block-face is generally one side of a city street between two consecutive intersections. The BFDF contains 1996 Census population and dwelling counts for block-faces in urban centres covered by Street Network Files. It also links the block-face to all higher levels of standard geography through geographic codes.

Postal Code Conversion File (PCCF): This computer file links the six-character postal code with standard 1996 Census geographic areas. It also provides x,y coordinates for a point representing the approximate location of the postal code to support mapping.

Postal Code and Federal Ridings (1996 Representation Order) File (PCFRF): This file provides a link between the six-character postal code and Canada's federal electoral districts (1996 Representation Order).

GEOGRAPHY SERVICES

Geocoding Service: This service allows users to define their own geographic areas of study for census data tabulations.

Custom Services: If the standard geography products do not satisfy a user's need, Geography Custom Services are available to produce non-standard geographic products by special request.

Custom Mapping: Thematic maps and other custom maps may be produced as a special request.

PRICES DIVISION

Mandate

Prices Division is responsible for producing price indexes covering a wide range of transactions in the economy, from consumer price indexes to industrial product price indexes, capital expenditures price indexes and farm input price indexes.

Price indexes are used in different ways by large groups of users, notably to deflate the National Accounts output, analyse the various economic variables (such as output and income) in real terms, and track inflation. They are also used to index and adjust contracts and government transfer payments to other governments and individuals.

In addition to time indexes, the Division produces some spatial comparisons at the national level and relative to OECD countries under the purchasing power parities program. In addition, the Division manages a program of spatial indexes with a very different purpose: to adjust the salaries of public servants working in isolated and foreign posts.

Regular production of price index statistics over a year includes:

- 97 releases in *The Daily*, five regular catalogue publications, analytical reports and many special requests;
- a statistical information service that meets customer requirements by producing electronic tables and computer printouts.





*Whole Farm Data Base (WFDB)

Integrating into one base the agricultural data, which are available from administrative and survey sources, is the essence of the WFDB. It offers users access to a wider than ever range of disaggregated physical and financial data at the farm level.

There are several major data sources currently offered in the WFDB: the *Taxation Data Program (TDP)*, the *Farm Financial Survey (FFS)*, the *June Crops Survey (JCS)* and the *July Livestock Survey (JLS)*. Please refer to the WFDB Reference Manual (appendix C) for a summary of the sampling and methodology for each of these data sources.

The WFDB is the product of a joint venture by Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada and Statistics Canada.

Estimates presented in the Agricultural Quick Facts cover farms with gross operating revenues of \$10,000 or more. Incorporated farms with agricultural sales below \$25,000 are excluded from the TDP.


