THE CORNELL LABORATORY OF ORNITHOLOGY presented the 14th Arthur A. Allen award to WILLIAM W.H. GUNN at a banquet held in October 1982.

IT IS WITH DEEP SADNESS that we announce the untimely death of DAVID I. MACKENZIE. A founding member of the SCO, David was a graduate of both University of Western Ontario and Manitoba. While completing a M.Sc. at the latter institution, he studied the ecology of kingbirds at Delta Marsh, a work on which he has published extensively. At the time of his death, David was a Ph.D. Student at the University of Toronto, where he was investigating patterns of geographic variation in the genus *Tyrannus*. He has also published on subjects relating to parasitology and botany and has studied altitudinal gradients in bird communities in the Okanagan Valley of British Columbia. In keeping with Dave's great love for books and his mastery of the literature, his friends at the University of Toronto have decided to establish a capital fund, to be used to purchase books for the Department of Zoology Library, in his name. AAAS-ARCTIC DIVISION is holding the 34th Alaska Science Conference in Whitehorse, Yukon, 28 September to 1 October 1983. DIVERS - MISCELLANEOUS

AN ARTICLE IN A RECENT WILDLIFE SOCIETY BULLETIN describes two cases of chlamydiosis (=psittacosis or ornithosis) in wildlife biologist working with wild waterfowl. Characters of the disease are persistent fevers, persistent influenzal disease, unresolved pneumonia that might follow an influenzal disease, or typhoid-like conditions that have negative routine tests. Persons who develop these types of illness after working with wild birds should discuss the possibility of chlamydiosis with their physicians, who may not consider the disease without some prompting.

IN NOVEMBER OF 1983 the ONTARIO FIELD ORNITHOLOGISTS group held an inaugural general meeting. This group is open to all people interested in birding. The OFO will publish a new journal entitled ONTARIO BIRDS to provide a forum for the exchange and dissemination of ideas and knowledge among birders. The first issue will appear in April 1983. This group also sponsors a number of field trips and outings. Membership in the OFO is \$10.00 annually. THE SCO CONSTITUTION allows the membership to make nominations for councillors (3 selected each year) and officers: president, vice president (president elect), treasurer, membership secretary, recording secretary and editor. 

XIX CONGRESSUS INTERNATIONALIS ORNITHOLOGICUS



Depuis la parution des dernières NOUVELLES le Comité national d'organisation s'est réuni à Ottawa en février et les membres de ce comité, les co-présidents du Comité des excursions, ainsi que les représentants canadiens désignés sur le Comité du programme scientifique, ont pu échanger des idées concernant les différentes activités à venir et amorcer la planification dans différents secteurs. Une visite du Centre Rideau a permis de constater les progrès et d'apprécier la qualité des installations. L'ouverture est prévue pour décembre 1983.

L'emblème du 19ième Congrès a été dévoilé et apparaît ci-dessus. Ce sera le signe officiel qui identifiera le Congrès dans toute correspondance et publication à venir.

Le Comité des excursions sur le terrain a considéré jusqu'à maintenant un grand nombre de propositions et sera en mesure au cours des prochains mois d'arrêter son choix sur les excursions qu'il sera possible d'offrir en 1986.

Since the publication of the last NEWSLETTER, the National Organization Committee has met in Ottawa last February and the members of this committee, the co-chairmen of the Field Excursions Committee, and the recently appointed Canadian members to the Scientific Programme Committee have shared numerous ideas and have started the planning of several activities for 1986. They visited Rideau Center and observed that the construction of the congress center is advanced and that it will provide quality facilities for I.O.C. The opening will be in December 1983.

The symbol of the 19th I.O.C. was presented and appears above. It will be used to identify our congress in all correspondence and publications.

The Field Excursions Committee has now considered a good number of proposals and will decide during the next months on those which will be possible to offer in 1986.
