The Canadian Conference of the Arts' *Diplôme d'honneur* is presented annually to a Canadian who has made a sustained contribution to the cultural life of the country, whether through individual arts practice, volunteer activity, mentoring, patronage, or other recognized support.

The first *Diplôme d'honneur* was awarded to the late Governor General Vincent Massey in 1954 in recognition of the Royal Commission Report on the Arts, Letters and Social Sciences. Since then, the CCA has recognized more than 70 visionaries and creators of Canada's rich cultural identity.

The CCA Awards Committee chooses the recipient of the *Diplôme d'honneur* from nominations submitted each year by the members of the CCA. Nominations must be received by the CCA **no later than April 30, 2006**. The Awards Ceremony will take place in Fall 2006. The award consists of a framed diploma and a talisman, cast in sterling silver, created by the late West Coast craftsman Bill Reid.
