Activity 1 - Word Puzzles

Activity 3 - Don't Build That Person

Instructions:

Activity 4 - Ask Your Friends To Guess

Materials needed: Recycled material, glue, paper, colour pens and pencils, Bristol board, coloured paper, straps, cloths, scissors etc.

Use your imagination. With these materials prepare something you can use to pretend you work in Kensington. Choose someone you think it would be nice to be. For example a veterinarian, a fish store owner, an artist, a clothes store owner, etc. Ask your friends to guess what profession you have chosen.

Activity 5 - Name Game

Instructions:

- 1. Use the grid on the next page or you can use graph paper.
- 2. Across the top, write the letters KENSINGTON in the squares.
- 3. Brainstorm some popular categories to use for the game
- 4. Down the left side, list your categories (one per square).
- 5. On the word "GO!" start the time for five minutes. Write words in each category that begin with the letter at the top. Fill in as many squares as you can.
- 6. Skip if you are stuck, and then go back to the ones skipped if you have time.
- 7. When the time is up, count how many squares you filled in.
- 8. Whoever has the most squares filled in correctly wins the game.
