


### Methodology

#### "Generally speaking, do you approve or disapprove of the way the current federal government is handling...?"



















"Has the quality of health care over the past two years improved, deteriorated or stayed the same?"







#### "Which of the following aspects of health care is of greatest importance to you?"














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## Familiarity with Kyoto Protocol

"How familiar are you with something called 'The Kyoto Agreement or Protocol'?"




## **Support for Kyoto Protocol**

#### "What impact do you think ratifying the Kyoto Protocol will have in each of the following areas?" (Filter: respondents aware of the Kyoto Protocol only)






"...[To what extent] do you support taking money from [other] program areas to fund the Canadian military?" [Sample: Those who support increased spending on military]



"Over the past year or so, do you think that Canada-U.S. relations have deteriorated, stayed the same or improved?"








"Do you think it would be a very good, somewhat good, not very good, or not at all a good idea **for Canada and the United States to have a common currency** - that is the same dollar?"

"Do you strongly agree, agree, disagree or strongly disagree with the following statement: Canadians and Americans basically have the same values."














### Canadian Participation in a UN-Sanctioned Military Intervention in Iraq


"Would you approve or disapprove of Canada's participation in a UN-sanctioned military intervention in Iraq?"






## Views of Americans on Iraq

"Would you favour or oppose invading Iraq with U.S. ground troops in an attempt to remove Saddam Hussein from power?"







"How likely do you think it is that you and your family will suffer from a terrorist attack in the next two years?







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


### Percentage of Population That Are INTERNET USERS (Last Month)

#### Percentage of Population That Are GOVERNMENT ONLINE USERS (Last Twelve Months)










"Percentage of population who used government online services in the past 12 months"






## **Use of GO Services**

### Use of Government Online services among Internet users















"How safe would you feel about using the Internet to provide the Government with this sort of personal information (credit card number, bank account number or annual income)?"








### Same-Sex Marriage By Region
