

"As we approach the anniversary of September 11th, which of the following words best characterize your overall outlook?"



"How would you rate the performance of the Government of [Canada/the US] in dealing with September 11th and its aftermath?"



"Which statement comes closest to your point of view?"








"Overall, how much impact over the last year did the events of September 11th and the fallout from the event have on..."



"Nearly one year later, please rate the impact of September 11th on the following areas..."



"In retrospect, do you support or oppose the Canadian military participation in Afghanistan in the aftermath of September 11th?"















"When you think of [Canada's military/the United States' military], how does it make you feel? Does it make you feel proud, embarrassed, or do you have no strong feelings one way or the other?"






"Would you support the Canadian government spending more on our military if it meant spending less in some other areas?"





"Since the events of 9/11, which of the following best describes how you feel toward Americans? Would you say you feel..."








#### Ties with U.S.

"Do you think Canada should have much closer ties to the US, somewhat closer ties, about the same as now, somewhat more distant or much more distant ties to the US than it has now?"



"Which of the following best describes the current relationship between Canada and the United States? Would you say the relationship is best described as...?"



"What country do you see as the closest ally of the US?"



"As a result of September 11, what do you think about the possibility to Canada becoming part of the United States?"










#### **Military Sovereignty**

"Do you think Canda's military on its own is capable of defending the country from attack or would Canada need the Americans to protect it?"



"Considering military relations between Canada and the U.S., which do you think would be best for Canada: closer military relations with the U.S. than we have now, less close military relations, or about the same as now?"







"I support creating a Canada-US security perimeter, even if it means we must effectively accept American security and immigration policies."



"Do you think Canada should share common border controls with the U.S.?"





"Some people say that the United States and Canada should adopt a common border policy and follow the same set of rules when deciding who can or cannot enter either country. Which is closest to your view?



















"Do you feel Canadian businesses <u>do</u> or <u>do not</u> have the ability to compete successfully with businesses in the United States."



"Would you say that Canada does each of the following things a lot better, somewhat better, about the same, somewhat worse or a lot worse than the United States?"






"Do you think Iraq poses a real threat to the United States?"









"In general, do you think the Americans should consult the countries that normally support them before launching a military attack on another country?"




"Would you be likely to support a military strike against Iraq if it was carried out by a number of countries, not just the U.S.?"

"Do you think George W. Bush's arguments provide enough justification for the United States to attack Iraq?"






"Given that Saddam Hussein has given the U.N. the right to inspect lraq's installations [...], do you think lraq is showing good faith or not?"













"It is possible for Canada to develop an alternative to the Kyoto Accord that is just as effective but would cost the Canadian economy a lot less."








# **Support for Ontario Court Ruling**

% in favour of the recent Ontario court ruling








# **Specific Rights for Homosexuals**




# Methodology

- Data is included up to October 4th to account for coverage of the Speech from the Throne




