
"What is the most important issue facing Canada today?"




"Do you think that governments in Canada have the ability to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices?"

"Do you think that governments in Canada have the ability to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices?"



"What is the main thing that governments should do in order to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices?"




## What Governments Can Do? (by region)





"Please indicate how much confidence you have in the following institutions."





Great deal and some confidence



"You don't really expect that politicians will keep their election promises once they are in power."



"None of the federal political parties really addresses the problems of people like yourself."










"Which statement comes closer to your view?"


"Do you think that political parties have been very effective, somewhat effective, neither effective nor ineffective or very ineffective in fulfilling roles you identified?"


"Are you aware or unaware that each federal political party received \$1.75 of taxpayers' money per year for every vote they received in the most recent election?"





"Do you think that there should be a fixed date for federal elections?"






"What grade would you give to: The federal government's performance in dealing with health care in Canada?"




### Performance of Heath Care System













"Does Canada accept the right number of immigrants per year?"





"Do you think we should be making a special effort to attract immigrants from some countries and not others or should we make no distinction and accept immigrants from all countries?"




"Do immigrants from some countries make bigger and better contributions than others?"



"How likely is it that an act of terrorism will take place in Canada within the next few years?"



"How likely is it that Canada will be a target of terrorism because it has troops in Afghanistan?"



### Preparedness for Terrorist Threat




"How well prepared is Canada to deal with a terrorist threat?"




"The powers of the government and police to combat terrorism have gone too far and threaten fundamental civil rights of all citizens?"





"Please tell me if you have a very favorable, somewhat favorable, somewhat unfavorable, or very unfavorable opinion of the United States?"







## U.S. Foreign Policy



"In making international policy decisions, to what extent do you think the U.S. takes into account the interests of countries like (survey country) - a great deal, a fair amount, not too much or not at all?"






### **Closest Ally**



"If you had to pick one country from around the world that you personally consider to be Canada's closest friend and ally, which country would it be?"




"If you had to pick one country from around the world that you personally consider to be the United States' closest friend and ally, which country would it be?"


