# Demographic Trends and the Minority-Language Communities in Canada 

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## Francophones outside Quebec

- Mother Tongue - 980,264

ㅁ Rate of growth - 36\% between 1951 \& 2001

- The number of Francophones grew between 1996 and 2001 by 10,057 (1\%). Outside Quebec the general population grew by $4.6 \%$.
- Growth varies from one province to another Francophones in the Yukon declined by 19.5\% while the rate of growth was $12.6 \%$ in the Alberta

## Anglophones in Quebec

- Mother tongue population - 591,000

ㅁ Decline of 4.9\% since 1996
$\square$ Decline has accelerated (up from $0.7 \%$ in 9196 period)
$\square$ Language spoken most often in the home (746,895) - down 15,560 or 2\% since 1996
