I, the undersigned state/official veterinarian, certify that:

- 4.1 The day-old poultry and hatching eggs exported from Canada to Georgia originate from premises (hatcheries) and/or administrative territorial units of Canada that are officially free from infectious animal diseases, including:
- OIE declared diseases, in particular avian influenza and Newcastle disease - during the last 12 months (except British Columbia and Saskatchewan provinces).
 - other avian influenza viruses - during the last 3 months on the farm;
 - ornithosis (psittacosis), paramyxovirus infection, turkey rhinotracheitis, contagious laryngotracheitis, infectious encephalomyelitis - during the last 6 months on the farm;
- 4.2 The parental flocks were examined serologically, using pullorium antigen, with negative results.
- 4.3 The hatching eggs were disinfected twice using methods accepted in Canada: within two hours of being laid and immediately before shipment to the importer.
- 4.4 Hatching eggs and day-olds were delivered in single-use crates or cages.
- 4.5 The means of transport were treated and prepared in accordance with the rules approved in Canada.
- 4.6 Day-old chicks were vaccinated against Marek's Disease.
