I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify that, after due enquiry and to the best of my knowledge and belief, the birds described below meet the following requirements:				
1. That the bird(s) have been hatched and raised in the country of exportation until their shipment to Cuba				
That the country of origin has implemented a surveillance program for notifiable avian influenza (NAI) and is officially free of HPAI over the last 3 years and at least 21 days prior to export, there have been no cases of Lowly Pathogenic Notificable Avian Influenza and no cases of Newcastle Disease for the 6 months prior to export.				
3. That the farm of origin of the birds has been free of Pscittacosis, Colibacilosis, Salmonellosis and Mycoplasmo for the 6 months prior to export.				
4. That the birds prior to the shipment to Cuba were subjected to the following investigations with negative result				
Avian Influenza - by Hemagluttination Inhibition method (HI) Newcastle Disease - by HI Psitacosis - by Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) Egg Drop Syndrome - HI AND				
Duck Viral Enteritis - no evidence of disease on the premises of origin for the past 12 months and no linical signs clincal signs of disease in the birds to be exported.				
5. The birds have been treated against internal and external parasites at least once, seven days prior to shipmer Cuba with

6. The bird(s) were inspected by a CFIA veterinarian immediately before exportation and found to be clinically healthy, free of infectious disease, have no fresh wounds and are free of parasites.				
The bird(s) being exported will not come into contact with any domestic poultry or other caged birds during their transit. The birds were transported in new, clean containers or in containers that had been cleaned, disinfected and approved by CFIA. The birds were conveyed in a safe way to prevent the contamination with any agent of infectious poultry disease.
