I, the undersigned official veterinarian for the Government of Canada hereby certify that to the best of my knowledge and belief, the rabbits described below meet the following requirements:

- 1. The rabbits were born and raised in Canada. (Apply to rabbits for breeding or commercial use only)
- 2. There has been no clinical or other evidence of tularemia, viral haemorragic disease of rabbits and myxomatosis for at least twelve (12) months prior to shipment to Japan in the flocks where the exported rabbits were born or raised (hereinafter referred to as "the flocks of origin").
- 3. There was no evidence of infectious diseases in the flocks of origin for at least thirty (30) days before export and no rabbit was introduced from external sources during this period.
- 4. The animals were examined today and showed no evidence of any infectious disease.
- 5. The animals were transported from the premises of origin to the port of exit in vehicles and containers that were previously cleaned and thoroughly disinfected.
- 6. The consignor was notified that all other containers, vehicles and loading places used during the transportation of the exported rabbits have to been cleaned and thoroughly disinfected.
