I, the undersigned Veterinarian, duly authorized by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency(CFIA) of the Government of Canada, certify that:

- 1. The kennel of origin of the exported dogs or wolves has shown no clinical signs of rabies, canine distemper, canine parvovirus, canine rotavirus, infectious hepatitis, canine coronavirus and Aujeszky's disease for the past two (2) years.
2. Within thirty (30) days before entering into the quarantine premises, the dogs or wolves have been vaccinated against rabies at a minimum age of three (3) months and against canine distemper, canine parvovirus, canine coronavirus, and infectious hepatitis at a minimum age of six (6) weeks. These vaccines were administered as stipulated by the manufacturer, on the dates mentioned below:

- 3. The dogs or wolves have been quarantined at a Government of Canada approved quarantine premises for thirty (30) days prior to export. The quarantine procedures were under the supervision of a veterinarian approved by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency for this purpose. The animals have been individually examined and found healthy by the approved veterinarian at least fourteen (14) days after their entry into pre-export quarantine.

- 4. The dogs or wolves were re-vaccinated against the above mentioned disease at least fourteen (14) days after their entry into pre-export quarantine, as stipulated by the manufacturer, on the date mentioned below:

During the quarantine period, the dogs or wolves for export have been treated for the main internal and external parasites existing in Canada with officially approved effective parasiticides which are licensed for use in Canada for internal and external parasites, under the supervision of the approved veterinarian.

- 6. The dogs or wolves to be exported were clinically examined by the approved veterinarian within twenty-four (24) hours of export and found to be apparently healthy and free from any sign of infectious or contagious diseases.
7. Feeds and bedding used during quarantine and transportation were from areas free of epizootic disease and meet the veterinary quarantine conditions.
8. During quarantine and transportation, the dogs or wolves exported were not in contact with animals not certified for export to China and were not transported through areas where serious epizootic diseases exist.
