SECTION I - GOVERNMENT VETERINARY CERTIFICATE

I, _____ an Official Veterinarian* of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency certify that after due enquiry and to the best of my knowledge and belief, the animals described below meet the following requirements:

1. They come from a government registered or licensed zoological gardens, wildlife park approved for the holding of non-domesticated carnivores.
2. They have been continuously resident in the premises of origin for at least six months prior to certification or since birth.
3. They come from a premises that is under veterinary supervision, and where a suitable health monitoring program, including microbiological and parasitological tests and necropsies, is implemented
4. They come from a premises that has remained free from any evidence of rabies during the past 12 months.
5. No case of Aleutian disease, Aujeszky's disease, babesiosis, brucellosis, pseudotuberculosis, transmissible spongiform encephalopathy, trichinosis, trypanosomiasis, tuberculosis or tularaemia has been diagnosed at the premises of origin in any animal of the same Family during the past 12 months
6. They have been kept in isolation from other animals not of the same health and residency status for at least 30 days prior to export and, during this time, have remained free from clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.

SECTION II - TESTING, TREATMENTS

7. Each animal was treated for internal and external parasites with an effective broad spectrum parasiticide during the 30 days prior to export and the dates of treatment, active ingredients and dose rates used for each animal are recorded in the individual health record attached to this *veterinary certificate*;

SECTION III - IDENTIFICATION

8. Each animal has been individually identified with an ISO-compliant microchip (transponder), and the site of implantation and the identification number of each animal is recorded below.

SECTION IV - TRANSPORTATION

9. Each animal was inspected by an *Official Veterinarian** within 72 hours prior to export and found to be healthy and fit to travel.
10. Will be shipped in a container that meets the appropriate container requirements specified in the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Live Animals Regulations.

***An *Official Veterinarian* is a veterinarian authorised by the *Veterinary Administration* of the country to perform animal health and/or public health inspections of *commodities* and, when appropriate, perform certification in conformity with the provisions of Section 1.2. of the OIE *International Animal Health Code* (the OIE Code).**
