SECTION I - HEALTH ATTESTATION

- I, ______ the undersigned official government veterinarian, authorised thereto by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), certify that the animals described in Section II:
- 1. Have been individually identified with a unique number of alphanumeric code, permanently applied to the animals by means of a transponder (microchip), correlating with the ISIS- and Stud-book number (if applicable). All identification numbers should be stated in this certificate (Section II).
- 2. The animals have been continuously in captivity in the premises of origin in the exporting country, either
 - * since birth or
 - * for the last 12 (twelve) months but less than 24 (twenty-four) months or
 - * for more than 24 (twenty-four) months.

- 3. Originate from a premises where no cases of Rabies, Marburg, Ebola and Simian Aids occurred during the 6 months prior to export to South Africa.
- 4. Originate from a premises where there has been no case of tuberculosis in the building or enclosure in which the animals reside, for the past 2 (two) years prior to export.
- 5. No cases of Salmonella, Shigella or Yersinia have been diagnosed in the last 6 (six) months in the primates included in this shipment or in any other primates with which they may have been in contact at the premises of origin.
- 6. Originate from an area which is not under any veterinary restriction for any disease to which primates are susceptible.
- 7. Originate from a country either:
 - * not listed by WHO as endemic for Yellow Fever, or
 - * there have been no cases in the exporting country for the past 12 (twelve) months, or
 - * the animals were inoculated against Yellow fever at least 10 days prior to departure for the Republic of South Africa.

- 8. In the case of macaques species: Originate from facilities, certified free of Herpes-B virus and have not been in contact with any macaques of a lesser/unknown health status.
- 9. Have been kept at an approved institution, for 30 (thirty) days prior to export to South Africa (pre-export isolation). This isolation facility ensures that these primates have not been in contact with primates of a lesser health status or new introductions of primates, and during this period, no illness due to infectious disease occured in this export group of animals.
- 10. Have been treated for internal and external parasites, at the beginning of the pre-export isolation of 30 (thirty) days.
- 11. Have been examined within 10 (ten) days prior to their departure for the Republic of South Africa, and were found to be healthy, clinically free from any infectious or contagious diseases to which their species are susceptible.
