I, the	undersigned Veterinary Officer, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify that:	
1.	Canada is free of foot-and-mouth disease, African swine fever, hog cholera, vesicular stomatitis, swine vesicular disease, Teschen disease, Aujeszsky's disease and <i>Brucella suis</i> .	
2.	The pigs identified in Section C come from a farm where there have been no outbreaks of the following diseases for the last twelve (12) months and individual animals for export examined in quarantine are free from clinical evidence of such diseases: brucellosis, leptospirosis, porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS), erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, transmissible gastroenteritis (TGE), postweaning multisystemic wasting syndrome (PMWS) and swine (vibrionic) dysentery.	
3.	The animals for export were isolated from all other animals for a minimum of thirty (30) days prior to export and not exposed to any of the above mentioned diseases during that period.	
4.	The animals for export are for breeding purposes and free from physical defects and deformities that could affect their breeding potential.	
5.	The animals for export were examined prior to shipment and found to be free from any evidence of infectious or contagious diseases.	
6.	The animals for export were not fed garbage at any time.	
7.	No animals, other than those tested for export to the Philippines were permitted to board the ship or aircraft at the time of embarkation.

1.	Leptospirosis: MAT for the serotypes L. pomona, L. canicola, L. icterohemorrhagiae, and L. tarasovi.
