



**VETERINARY HEALTH CERTIFICATE  
EXPORT OF BREEDING SWINE TO HONG KONG**

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, duly authorized by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency, certify that:

1. Canada has been officially free from foot-and-mouth disease, vesicular stomatitis, swine vesicular disease, African swine fever, classical swine fever, porcine brucellosis and Aujeszky's disease during the twelve (12) months prior to export.
2. The animals have been kept since birth or for the last six (6) months prior to export in premises where no case of the following diseases was officially reported: Aujeszky's disease, rabies, trichinellosis, atrophic rhinitis of swine, porcine cysticercosis, porcine brucellosis, transmissible gastroenteritis, enterovirus encephalomyelitis and porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS).
3. The animals have been examined by a veterinarian of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency and found to be in good health and showed no evidence of infectious or contagious diseases.
4. The animals showed no clinical signs of the diseases mentioned above in section 1 and 2.
5. The animals showed no clinical signs of leptospirosis, were kept in an establishment in which no clinical signs of leptospirosis were officially reported during the ninety (90) days prior to shipment and were injected twice with dihydrostreptomycin or streptomycin at a dosage of 25 mg/kg of live body weight, the first injection being given fourteen (14) days prior to shipment and the second on the last working day before the day of shipment.

Note: In the case where dihydrostreptomycin is not available, the swine were injected twice with oxytetracycline at 25 mg/kg, the first injection being given fourteen (14) days prior to shipment and the second on the last working day before the day of shipment.

- a) This certificate is valid only for animals exported to Hong Kong by air.
  - b) The animals must be transported in accordance with the current Live Animals Regulations of International Air Transport Association (IATA) and in such a way to ensure humane management at loading.
  - c) This certificate must be accompanied by a valid permit for the importation of breeding pigs to Hong Kong issued by the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department, Hong Kong.
