I, the undersigned Veterinarian, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify that:

## **Section I: General Health Requirements**

- The animals originate from Canada, a country free from African swine fever, classical swine fever, enterovirus 1. encephalomyelitis (Teschen disease), Aujeszky's disease, brucellosis (B. suis and B. abortus) and rinderpest. Canada has been recognized free of foot-and-mouth disease, without vaccination, by OIE for a minimum of three (3) years prior to export.
- The animals originate from premises where no clinical signs or other evidence of porcine reproductive and 2. respiratory syndrome (PRRS) has been found during the two (2) years prior to export and vaccination against PRRS is not permitted on the farm.
- During the twelve (12) months prior to export, no clinical signs or other evidence of tuberculosis, brucellosis, 3. leptospirosis, swine vesicular disease, vesicular exanthema, swine influenza, porcine parvovirus infection, enterovirus encephalomyelitis, transmissible gastroenteritis, atrophic rhinitis, toxoplasmosis, thrichinosis and streptococcus suis type 2 infection has been found at the premises where the animals originated and/or has been resident.

#### Section II: Quarantine, Testing and Treatments

- All animals to be exported to Thailand were subjected to isolation in an approved premises under the control of an 4. official veterinarian of the Canadian government for a period of at least thirty (30) days prior to export and during that period, the animals were tested for the following diseases using test methods or other methods recommended by the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE), with negative results.
  - Transmissible gastroenteritis SN or ELISA i)
  - ii) Porcine respiratory and reproductive syndrome - ELISA iii)
    - Leptospirosis microscopic agglutination test (MAT)

The animals were treated with two (2) injections of dihydrostreptomycin (25 mg/kg of live body weight) at a fourteen (14) day interval with the second injection being given the last working day before shipment. Or the animals have been treated with an alternate antibiotic, at the manufactures recommended dosage, that is efficacious in the treatment of leptospirosis.

iv) Atrophic Rhinitis - The animals for export were tested for atrophic rhinitis by ELISA or PCR with negative results in a laboratory approved for this purpose;

- 2. While in transit, the animals must not come in contact with other animals of lower health status.
- 3. Unloading or movement of the animals may only take place under the approval and supervision of the veterinary authorities of the transit country;
- 4. No swine or other animals of lower health status, animal feed or fodder is allowed to be taken on board the ship/aircraft after leaving the Canada;
- 5. The accommodation provided for the animals during shipping must be designed to avoid any risk of injury and unnecessary suffering which is compliance with the relevant criteria laid down in the Appendix titled "Transport of Animals" of the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) or Part XII of the Canadian Health of Animals Regulations.
- 6. For the import of breeding animals to Thailand the animal pedigree certificate shall accompany the shipment.
