**Sanitary Information**

I, the undersigned official veterinarian, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify that, after due enquiry and to the best of my knowledge and belief, the day old poultry described below meet the following requirements:

1. The country is free from Notifiable Avian Influenza (all H5 and H7 serovars and those serovars considered to be as Highly pathogenic as defined by the OIE).
2. The day olds are hatched in an incubator in which no eggs from any infected source had been hatched and the incubator was properly fumigated prior to hatching.
3. The day old birds are drawn from an establishment where Newcastle Disease, Infectious Bursal Disease, Marek's disease, Mycoplasmosis, Fowl typhoid, Pullorum disease, Fowl Pox, Avian Infectious Bronchitis, Avian Infectious Laryngotracheitis, Avian Tuberculosis, Psittacosis-ornithosis, Fowl cholera, Salmonella enteritidis, West Nile Virus, Salmonella typhimurium, Egg Drop Syndrome, Avian Encephalomyelitis, avian leucosis J virus, Chicken Anemia and inclusion body hepatitis infection have not been reported in the last 12 months.
4. The flocks of origin have been in the country for at least 12 months and during this period they have not come into contact with any imported birds and have never been fed with feed of meat and bone meal of ruminant (excluding fish meal).
5. The day old birds come from an establishment or a hatchery which is regularly inspected by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency and complies with the standards referred to in the relevant Appendix of the OIE International Animal Health Code.
6. The exporting country should have conducted a sero-surveillance within 45 days ahead of export and the status in respect of Avian Influenza (H5 & H7) should be negative by Agar Gel Immunodiffusion.
7. The parents of the G.P. Stock to be imported should not have been vaccinated against Avian influenza (H5 & H7). If any other vaccine except above is used, the same has to be indicated along with the name of the vaccine, manufacturer and the date of vaccination. This information is to be appended to the zoosanitary certificate.
8. The eggs are shipped in new, fresh, clean, and disinfected packages.
