I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, do certify, in respect to the animals described below, that:

1. Each animal originates from Canada, a country free of African horse sickness, glanders, horse pox, epizootic lymphangitis, vesicular stomatitis and dourine.
2. Each animal originates from a farm where there has been no outbreaks of equine infectious anemia, equine viral arteritis, strangles, equine influenza, equine encephalomyelitis, equine piroplasmiasis, equine rhinopneumonitis and equine paratyphoid for the three (3) months prior to export to Japan.
3. During the year preceding shipment of the animal, there have not been any outbreaks of Potomac fever either on the farm of origin or any premises that the animal may have been on during that period.
4. Each animal was kept isolated from any other animal not intended to be exported to Japan for at least seven (7) days prior to shipment on premises approved for this purpose by an official of the Government of Canada and, during that period, was inspected by a salaried veterinarian of the Government of Canada and found to be in good health and free from any evidence of communicable diseases.

5. Either each animal has been vaccinated twice against West Nile fever at three (3) to six (6) week interval (or only once in the case of annual booster) during the twelve (12) month period preceding shipment to Japan;

6. All equipment, containers and vehicles used for transportation of the animals were cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by the CFIA and the horses did not come in contact with any other animal not intended for export to Japan.
7. All hay, straw, feed, bedding used from the commencement of the embarkation quarantine to the arrival in Japan were of Canadian origin and not known to be infected with causative agent of contagious diseases.
