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Unfortunate that Andy will be away but we will need to address in early April when Jim is back also. I think that our initial approach to aquaculture is the correct handling, but with some details added. I still believe that we do not want to profile (target) aquaculture as it is just another source of risk to natural populations. I think what people may have wanted is:

- 1) a clear statement (i.e., New Principle 1) that conservation of wild natural salmon comes first (we can do this)
- 2) a short piece on the regulatory framework for aquaculture (Province, DFO, others?) and what that industry needs to be compliant with (this may be a new paragraph), and website references for current site guidelines, and
- 3) a explanation of aquaculture within CU's (as we have already done)

Any thing more would likely not be well received by the Province or aquaculture industry. The only other thought I was considering is an expression of the Departments goal of sustainable aquaculture (there must be a clear statement of what this is intended to mean) and that sustainable aquaculture must be considered within the framework of the WSP. Thoughts?
