MORPHOLOGIC DIAGNOSES:

Slide 7, P3-36-1:

1). Liver: Hepatitis, minimal, multifocal, random, lymphocytic, chronic

There are no significant lesions in the kidney, spleen, heart, peripheral vasculature or peripheral nerves.

Slide 8, P3-36-2:

There are no significant lesions in the posterior kidney, corpuscle of Stannius, liver, heart, peripheral vasculature or peripheral nerves.

Slide 9, P3-36-3:

1). Liver: Hepatitis, mild to moderate, multifocal, random, necrotising and hemorrhagic, acute

There are no significant lesions in the kidney, spleen, heart, peripheral vasculature or peripheral nerves.

Slide 10, P3-36-4:

There are no significant lesions in the kidney, liver, spleen, heart, peripheral vasculature or peripheral nerves.

COMMENTS:

In slide 9, the necrohemorrhagic hepatitis would have contributed only mildly to moderately to impaired liver function; although close evaluation of the tissue failed to reveal any discernible pathogens, the possibility of an underlying infectious process cannot be entirely discounted. Additional differentials may include hypoxic, toxic and metabolism entities. The more chronic hepatitis in slide 7 is low grade, non-specific and likely related to a long past antigenemia. There were no other significant lesions within the examined tissues.
