

## 2008/09 Challenges and Opportunities

- Improved communications
- Uncertainty surrounding resources and time required to apply benchmarks across all CUs
- Habitat and ecosystem monitoring will likely require significant partnering across all orders of government and NGO's.
- Effective planning will require an appropriate governance structure
- WSP planning requires effective integration across other change initiatives such as PICFI, EPMP, FSWP
- Numerous NGO's are putting resources to assist implementation – Moore/Skeena, WWF- watershed planning, Suzuki Foundation – Strategy 4, Watershed Watch - Benchmarks
