


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
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Tidal water boundaries on Lower Mainland rivers

How to Use This Supplement

The *Freshwater Salmon Supplement* is designed to help you find the information you need to know before sport fishing for salmon in freshwater (non-tidal) in British Columbia (B.C.), Canada. This booklet is intended as a supplement to the provincial government's *British Columbia Freshwater Fishing Regulations Synopsis*.

For regulations regarding freshwater species other than salmon, refer to the provincial government's *Synopsis*.

Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) is responsible for regulating sport fishing in tidal waters and salmon fishing in freshwater.

The information in this booklet is valid from April 1, 2009 to March 31, 2011.

For salmon regulations in **tidal** waters, close the booklet and flip over to the other side.

Before you go fishing in freshwater (non-tidal waters):

1. Purchase a Non-Tidal Angling Licence. Purchase a salmon conservation stamp if you intend to keep a salmon of any legal size or species. Check the **Licensing** section for more information on obtaining a licence. Ensure your licence is with you when fishing.
2. Check the map of B.C. at left to find your fishing **Region**.
3. Turn to the Region-specific salmon fishing regulations (on the following pages).
4. **Prior to fishing**, check for current and up-to-date fishing information. Contact the DFO office nearest to where you intend to fish or visit DFO's website for updates. Also check the *Synopsis* for other closures and gear restrictions:  www.env.gov.bc.ca/fw/fish/
It is your responsibility to know the regulations prior to fishing.
5. If you want to fish for freshwater species other than salmon, consult the *Synopsis*.

Points to remember when salmon fishing in freshwater

- Check to determine if the location you intend to fish is open.
- All limits are subject to closure times. If an area is closed, the retention limit is zero (0).
- It is illegal to catch or attempt to catch salmon by snagging or with snares.
- It is illegal to wilfully hook a salmon on any part of its body other than in the mouth. You may not retain any accidentally foul-hooked salmon.
- It is illegal to sport fish for salmon and trout, except by angling.
- Return the head of your salmon with a missing adipose fin to a Salmon Sport Head Recovery Depot near you. See page 71 of the Tidal Waters section for further information.
- There are no salmon in Region 4 (Kootenays). For information on other freshwater species in Region 4, refer to the *British Columbia Freshwater Fishing Regulations Synopsis*.
- Check each region's Salmon Table for the definition of an "adult chinook" for that area.

Licensing

A Non-Tidal Angling Licence is a provincial government issued fishing licence. For information on Non-Tidal Angling Licence categories and current fees, visit:  www.env.gov.bc.ca/fw/fish/

Angling licence information for non-tidal waters is also available in the annual *British Columbia Freshwater Fishing Regulations Synopsis*.

Provincial Salmon Conservation Stamp

Your Non-Tidal Angling Licence must be validated with a Non-Tidal Salmon Conservation Surcharge Stamp to keep a salmon of any legal size or species (other than kokanee) from non-tidal waters. A stamp is not required if you intend to release all salmon caught. You must record all retained adult chinook salmon immediately, in ink, on the back of your Non-Tidal Angling Licence.

Habitat Conservation Trust Fund

Part of the cost of your angling licence goes to the Habitat Conservation Trust Fund to enhance and protect fish stocks and habitat in all regions of British Columbia.

Each year, the Trust Fund supports more than 150 projects ranging in budget from \$2,000 to \$300,000. For more information on the Habitat Conservation Trust Fund, call **1-800-387-9853** or check the website:  www.hctf.ca

Natural Bait Concerns

Anglers should be aware that the use of natural bait products has been linked to the transmission of viral, bacterial and parasitic infections in fish. Carrying fish and fish products, including roe, from one area to another may permit the transfer of pathogens capable of seriously affecting local fish stocks. These include infectious pancreatic necrosis (IPN) virus and other viral pathogens and bacterial kidney disease of salmon and trout.

In order to protect stocks, do not transfer untreated roe or other fish products from one body of water to another. If you are using roe, combined treatments of freezing and Borax or heating and Borax will assist in minimizing disease transfer.

Illegally Introduced Alien Fish Species

The presence of alien fish species in B.C.'s lakes and streams is increasing. Examples of these species include largemouth and smallmouth bass, yellow perch, black crappie, sunfish, and northern pike.

These alien fish species are being illegally introduced by people who may be unaware of the negative consequences to resident (native) fish species. Alien fish species compete directly with resident fish species for food and specialized habitat; they also prey on resident fish. These non-native species can significantly reduce the number of highly desirable angling species such as trout and salmon, and may even wipe out the desired species entirely in some areas.

DFO is working in cooperation with provincial fisheries agencies to protect B.C.'s salmon, and other native fish and their habitat, from alien fish species. A video/DVD entitled Stop the Alien Aquatic Invaders is available through the Habitat Conservation Trust Fund (1-800-387-9853).

Freshwater Salmon Sportfishing Regulations

Region 1 - Vancouver Island

Please read these regulations in conjunction with the *B.C. Freshwater Fishing Regulations Synopsis*.

1. **Unless otherwise stated in the table, the daily limit in all waters of Region 1 is zero (0).**
2. The aggregate daily limit for all species of Pacific salmon (other than kokanee) from tidal and non-tidal waters combined is four (4).
3. All retained chinook and sockeye must measure 30 cm or more from tip of nose to tail fork, and all coho must measure 25 cm or more.
4. A single barbless hook is in effect year round for all streams in Region 1.
5. There is an annual limit of 10 adult chinook from all non-tidal waters. All retained adult chinook must be recorded immediately on the back of your freshwater angling licence.
An "adult chinook" in Region 1 is defined as being over 50 cm.

Please read these regulations in conjunction with the *B.C. Freshwater Fishing Regulations Synopsis*.

1. **Unless otherwise stated in the table, the daily limit in all waters of Region 2 is zero (0).**
2. The aggregate daily limit for all species of Pacific salmon (other than kokanee) from tidal and non-tidal waters combined is four (4).
3. All retained coho must measure 25 cm or more from tip of nose to tail fork, and all retained chinook, chum, pink, and sockeye must measure 30 cm or more from tip of nose to tail fork.
4. A single barbless hook is in effect year round for all streams in Region 2.
5. There is an annual limit of 10 adult chinook from all non-tidal waters. All retained adult chinook must be recorded immediately on the back of your freshwater angling licence.
 An "adult chinook" in Region 2 is defined as being over 50 cm except in the following areas where an "adult chinook" is defined as being over 62 cm:
 - a) the Fraser River downstream of the powerline crossing approximately 1 km above the Agassiz/Rosedale bridge from Sep 01 - Dec 31
 - b) the Chilliwack/Vedder River (including Sumas River); the Harrison River and the Capilano River.
